WORKDAY 23 USER INTERFACE ENHANCEMENTS

Soon you will see some changes in Workday...

- The Home page is being simplified to reduce horizontal and vertical scrollbars and optimized to run its best at different screen resolutions.
- Worklets now expand to *full-page views* with a more inviting interface.
- The existing *Org Chart* and *Directory Swirl* are being replaced with a new way to navigate the organization. The enhanced org chart is being optimized to run effectively at different screen resolutions and the print format has been improved.
- Enhancements to the mobile platform allow you to configure the home page and provide a new org chart experience.
- These are *cosmetic* changes that do not impact your business processes!

HOME PAGE WORKLETS



As part of an effort to support the Desktop UI on all device types and screen resolutions, Workday has redesigned the Home Page to recognize the screen size (regardless of device) and optimize the UI to display within the given space.

Additionally, sometimes when a worklet was opened the content exceeded the size of the expanded area beneath the worklet. This introduced multiple scroll bars and hid content outside of the visible range.

These Home page changes give improved access to content and an better display of a large amount of information.

The Home page and worklet layout now reformat as the screen is resized, optimizing the available space.

Worklet Opened:

The worklet content no longer opens beneath the icon. Instead, you are taken to a *full page* experience which displays more content.

The icon and name of the opened worklet display in the header of the page to give context.

A button in the top-left corner returns you Home.

The worklet Actions and View links have been *changed to buttons*, so that the click target is visually prominent to the user and supports finger selection on touch devices.


THE NEW ORG CHART

The existing Org Chart and Directory Swirl are being replaced with a new way to navigate the organization.

The new Org Chart is being optimized to run with improved performance at different screen resolutions.

Navigation through organization levels is faster and no longer requires resizing.

The print format has been improved.



MOBILE ENHANCEMENTS

The mobile app has also been updated. The home page is now configurable, allowing you to move icons around, and the org chart enhancements available on the desktop are also included for mobile.
